FOOTBALL REPORT

PHIV DEMETRIOU - GENERAL MANAGER OF FOOTBALL

Within the Football department, season 2022 commenced with all coaches appointed and setting up preseason

Appointments

- Men's Seniors coach Mark Murray;
- Men's Reserves coach Rick Gheller;
- Women's Seniors coaches Simon Brownhill and Iain Weinzierl;
- Women's Reserves Coach Mick Clohesy;
- Men's Thirds Co-coaches Anthony Demetriou and John Farah and;
- Assistant coaches to support each of these.

During the course of the year, a number of areas we covered, as per below:

- 1. Leadership program, again, an elite program and a point of difference. Although still room for improvement, this program will certainly assist all coaches and the culture of the club in years to come. It was clearly evident that we need to improve in this space and with the correct appointments
- 2. Mentor coaches, continually assisting and conversing with all of them, in particular men's seniors assistant coach Zac Jardine, men's reserves coach Rick Gheller and women's coaches Simon Brownhill, Iain Weinzierl and Mick Clohesy
- 3. Catch ups one on one, which I did preseason and outlined set plays, leadership program, decision making, game sense drills and coaching in general
- 4. Meetings pre, during, and post year for all coaches
- 5. Team play and tactics provided coaches with set plays for their use if they wanted them
- 6. Key performance indicators (KPIs) made it mandatory (points of difference, which were carried out)
- 7. Review coaches and provide feedback throughout the year
- 8. Training sessions, drills focus on game sense. Coaches were continually prompted to base the majority of training sessions on decision making and game sense drills, with additional focus on game style and set plays running patterns, leading patterns
- 9. Training program coaches were asked to ensure to set up zone coaching (backs, mids and forwards work) and technical skills, craft, etc
- 10. Development program held for the women in particular, attending a number of sessions to assist in all skills of the game
- 11. Regular communication pre and post games, I communicated with all coaches
- 12. Female kicking program I ran a number of sessions with the team and saw improvement
- 13. Match reports to be provided after each game there is still room for improvement here
- 14. I attended monthly committee meetings and updated the committee with details of season

15. Ran some coaching sessions for teams at Hawthorn Citizens and a coaches' night, trying to maintain a close relationship with them, establishing a pathway between their club and ours

In my role, I wanted to see continuous improvement, points of difference and we want to be a destination club to keep going through the grades. Unfortunately, with injuries and players unavailable throughout the year, the year was nowhere as successful as 2021.

Men

- The seniors had a disappointing year missing the finals after finishing on top of the ladder in 202. 51 players played, such was the impact of injuries and players unavailable. Injury players missed 167 games versus unavailability 70 games, so was really a year to forget and build again for 2023.
- The irony is that South Melbourne Districts won the Grand Final. We beat them and should have beaten them Round 1. Parkside was their opponent in the Grand Final and we also beat them convincingly during the year.
- Reviewed our scores and we averaged nine goals per game and 68 points per game not great figures.
- We reviewed the year with coach Mark Murray to look at changes for season 2023, speaking to the leadership group and others, as we didn't want a repeat of 2022.
- Reserves struggled throughout won only won five matches for the year and which was a by product of the figures re the seniors unavailability and injuries and filtered down to the Reserves. They finished 7th.
- Reserves Coach Rick Gheller not going on in 2023 and he did a fantastic job with what he had at his disposal, with the problems experienced, already mentioned. Rick had great people skills, was committed, had a diligent work ethic, was passionate, and had a great rapport with all players. He made numerous phone calls and his communication skills throughout the year were exemplary. We thank him for his time at the club.
- Some coaches were asked to attempt their Level 2 accreditation and I will assist them in the process. Zac completed his Level 2.

Women

- We started 2022 with two teams which proved enormous for the club and because of the efforts of Simon and Iain with their recruiting. They were determined to get two teams up which they did.
- The senior team made the finals and unfortunately just lost their game played in poor conditions, wind, rain, etc. There is massive upside in this group and could be strong for years. We won our first six games, then unfortunately, injuries and players unavailable, impacted our place in the top 4, going from top of ladder to 4th.
- They had great numbers with big numbers at training, which was terrific and fielded two teams every week. Improvement was evident as the year progressed.
- I attended a number of sessions and worked on kicking, set plays and a game style, mainly all educational.

• The reserves team also made the finals, which was a great effort and well coached by Mick, as a number of players were very new to the game and were being educated throughout the year.

Spartans/Men's Thirds

- Unfortunately after five premierships and 11 great years as part of HAFC, the Thirds (Spartans) decided to withdraw from season 2022. The Spartans won flags in 2013, 2015, 2016, 2018 and 2019 a fantastic record. Huge impact of Covid, age demographics, numbers decreasing, playing in Premier Thirds and players unavailable became too difficult to pursue. The HAFC were great support and to coaches Anthony Demetriou, John Farah and General manager George Demetriou, we thank them enormously for all their efforts throughout the journey. They really did a colossal job with everything within this team.
- Both Anthony and John, under my tutelage and mentoring became Level 2 coaches in 2022 and were excellent at their craft and hopefully prove very valuable to the senior club
- Some players filtered into the seniors but a number couldn't commit to twice a week training, so started withdrawing from all teams which was unfortunate, as it impacted numbers.

We don't have access to placing numerous signs around our oval like district and country footy clubs do, so we must find other avenues to please our partners.

This is essentially measured by the amount of business we can give back to our sponsoring partners, but a further key aspect is the level of social media exposure that we can create for the sponsors (most often through the great work of Emily Scott).

An additional aspect that we have introduced for our sponsors this year is to send each of them a list of their fellow sponsors and encouraging them to achieve Business to Business support to each other; hopefully early in 2023, we can arrange for a breakfast or afternoon sundowner to get many of our sponsors together on a social/business basis to hear a guest speaker of mutual interest. Further to this, Emily Scott has agreed to produce a logo for each sponsor to be placed in our clubrooms during pre-season 2023.
